STUDENT ACTIVITY FEES

Student activity fees for the 2016-2017 school year are \$30 and can be paid in Homeroom during September or to Nikki Levasseur in the counselling office thereafter. This is not a textbook fee. The fee supports various students' activities and special events throughout the year.

We accept cheques made out to ADSS or cash and have an ATM on site as well. No debit or credit. One cheque can be made to include yearbook and student fees. If \$30 is a bit much to pay at one time, installments can be made over the course of the year.

GET YOUR YEARBOOK!!

Yearbook order forms are available now. The books are \$55.00 this year for the basic book or \$60 for a personalized book with the student name printed on the cover. Sales will end December 18th and quantities are limited so don't be disappointed. Any additional sales after December are not necessarily guaranteed and will be at an increased cost. ADSS AGENDA APP

The updated ADSS App is now available for students and parents to download. The App is, at its heart, a day-to-day agenda that allows students to track which classes they have each day. Additionally, the app allows students to record their homework or other notes for each class.

The App is also a communication tool as it allows the school to send notifications directly to cell phones. Those notifications can be limited to important notifications such as school closures or reminders of report card release dates. You can also subscribe to specific channels to receive notifications for areas of special interest such as school teams or Graduation. These notifications will be another way that we can provide both parents and students with timely information updates and reminders.

The App works on cell phones as well as tablets and iPods and is available from either the Android or Apple App store. A handy user guide for the App will be available on the ADSS website.


<u>UPDATED DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION</u>

We want to keep our demographic and contact information for students and parents as current as possible. IMPORTANT REMINDER for Grade 12 Students...

All Grade 12 students must complete the Ministry of Education - Graduation Transitions Program. Grad Transition is a 4 credit course, which is intended to prepare students for a successful transition to life after high school. In order to meet this goal, all students must:

- Complete a minimum of 30 hours of volunteer OR work experience
- Complete 90 hours of physical activity (if they did not take PE in Grade 11 or 12)
- Complete the Graduation Transition Booklet(introduced in English 12) & hand in a resume
- Attend the Grad Transition Exit Interview





Graduation Transition Booklets are due on Tuesday, February 28th.

You must hand in your Graduation Transition Booklet along with a sample resume and cover letter to the Career Centre in order to be eligible to participate in the Exit Interview process.

The Graduation Exit Interviews will be taking place on Thursday, April 27th. For more information or to book your interview time please come to the Career Centre.

OVERDUE TEXT BOOKS AND LIBRARY BOOKS

One of the single largest expenses that our school deals with on a year to year basis is related to the replacement of textbooks and library books that have been borrowed but not returned. On average, replacement of lost, damaged or non-returned textbooks costs the school \$25,000 each year. This a very large number and greatly impacts the funds that we have available to support other needs in the school. Students are loaned these books on a yearly basis no differently than from the public library. Once signed out, the books are fully the responsibility of the student. Our expectations are that the books are cared for and returned in the condition they were in when the student received them. Damaged or lost books will result in a repair or replacement fine.

Rainbows

(Helping kids cope with grief and loss) and

Triple P Family Transitions Program

(Coping with parenting through separation and divorce)

You're divorced or separated and your child is caught in the middle. You may have problems with your extended family, your new partner or your ex. Holidays and birthday cause arguments and you may be concerned about your finances. With all of these changes, you're worried about the impact this is all having on your child's behavior and emotions. If this sounds familiar, Family Transitions Triple P can help. Island Health is partnering with Family Guidance to simultaneously bring the Rainbows Program (helping kids deal with grief and loss) to children ages 6-12 and the Triple P Transitions Program to parents dealing with separation and divorce.

Groups will begin on Tuesday, October 4/16. Rainbows will be from 6:00 – 7:00 pm and will run for 10-12 weeks. Come and check out Transitions and let's have a conversation about what will meet your needs and the needs of your family. Transportation and child-minding will be provided, if necessary.

Message from Education Minister Mike Bernier

October 4, 2016

Dear Parent,

I'm writing today to ask you to share your opinions with the Ministry of Education as we work to update student reporting in kindergarten through Grade 9. Students in these grades are experiencing B.C.'s new curriculum in classrooms in every part of the province.

We are adapting the curriculum in B.C. schools so kids learn the skills they need to succeed in our changing world. This means we also need to develop a new reporting approach. Right now the progress of your child is reported in many different ways, including report cards, parent teacher meetings, and regular student/parent/teacher check-ins.

Reporting is all about keeping parents like you informed, and we want you to tell us HOW you want to be informed and keep track of your child's progress. Until February 28 next year you can submit your thoughts online at engage.gov.bc.ca/yourkidsprogress.

As well, community meetings will be held in 10 communities across the province over the coming months so parents can ask questions and share their input. Check the website for times and locations as they are scheduled.

The ultimate goal of this engagement is to develop a student reporting process that gives families a deeper understanding of their child's progress at school through timely and comprehensive information. We'll gather the feedback and share our plan next June.

Our education system is one of the most highly ranked in the world. Students are finding success in music, in academics, in sports – and in every subject in between. Together parents, teachers, and the education system are making sure we build on that for an even better tomorrow.
