Applicants are urged to submit **NEAT** and **CAREFULLY COMPLETED** application forms. **The deadline to submit completed applications to the Career Centre is Friday, April 5th, 2019.**

A PERSONAL LETTER, COPY OF UNOFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT, SEMESTER 2 MARKS COLLECTION FORM AND A RESUME MUST BE INCLUDED WITH EACH APPLICATION FORM. Emphasize your past achievements and your future plans.

The Awards Ceremony will be held in the ADSS Auditorium at 7:00pm on Wednesday, June 12th. All recipients will be notified prior to the Ceremony and will be expected to attend.

If you receive an award, please be sure to write a thank you letter. Most of these Organizations & Donors consist of volunteer members who put in a lot of time and effort to provide these Scholarship & Bursary funds. Contact information will be provided when you receive your Award Certificate.

DIRECTIONS

1. **What do I do first?**

Read the List of Scholarships and Bursaries and select those for which you are qualified.

NOTE: **You must state how or why you are qualified in the last paragraph on the second page of the Scholarship Application. Please thoughtfully answer this one – donors pay attention to how you answer it!**

2. **Does the Scholarship Require a Specific Application?**

Some do, those Scholarships or Bursaries will be marked with an **S**

These separate applications are kept in a file located in the Career Centre. Your application for that Scholarship or Bursary will not be considered if it is not done on the right form. For all others, just fill out the application form that is included in this package.

3. **What do I need to send with my application form?**

Complete the application forms and attach to each application a copy of:

1. **PARAGRAPH OR ESSAY** (*only if specifically requested*)
2. **PERSONAL LETTER**
3. **YOUR UNOFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT** (*for completed courses, see pg. 25 of booklet*)
4. **MARKS COLLECTION FORM** (*for Semester 2 courses you are currently taking*)
5. **RESUME**
6. **REFERENCE LETTERS** (*if you have any that you would like to share*)

Several applications require additional information and references. A sample of the personal letter is available in the Career Centre. If the requirements of the bursary/scholarship specify a handwritten letter, make sure it

is written in ink, not typed on the computer. Also, please be sure to sign your letter. *****Please use regular 8.5 x 11 paper – no legal sized paper.**

4. Do I have to write out a separate application form for each scholarship?

No. Complete your application form, leaving out the first question, which is the name of the scholarship and the last question, which is how you qualify. You may copy this application as many times as you need to, and then fill in the scholarship name and reason(s) you qualify on each of the copies.

5. Are my documents in the correct order?

Put the completed application form at the front and staple everything together. Do not put in an envelope or duo tang. Staple in this order – see #3 above.

Keeping Track - If you wish to keep track of the scholarships you are applying for, use the indexes at the back of this package.

6. What do I do with my applications after I have completed them?

Return the completed application forms to Mrs. Wynans in the Career Centre by 3pm on Friday, April 5th. *****No late forms will be accepted.**

REMEMBER: “Scholarships” are not restricted to the “A” students...a good C+ average will be considered. Also, most awards are given to students proceeding to **ANY** post-secondary institution, which includes University, College, BCIT, or Vocational Institutions.

Furthermore, a considerable amount of money is available in the form of bursaries that depend more on financial need or volunteer work & community involvement, rather than on high marks.

Some of the scholarships have specific criteria. For example:

- your field of study or the courses you are currently in
- the organization your parents belong to
- the organization you belong to
- need - be sure to check to see if the scholarship is based on need - even if you don't have the other qualifications, they may still consider you if you show sufficient need.

**SCHOLARSHIPS FOR WHICH YOU MUST BE ENROLLED IN
4 ACADEMIC COURSES**

1 CAROLYN LEE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP – Minimum of \$500

Awarded to a student going to a University starting within eight months of graduation. Based on marks, future plans and financial need. Must have a “B” average.

2 ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION, Alberni Valley Branch #293 MEMORIAL Scholarships – \$750

Awarded to a son/daughter or grandson/granddaughter of a Military Service Veteran or a member of Legion Branch Alberni Valley 293 in good standing who is proceeding to a post-secondary institution. This applicant must be enrolled in a post-secondary institution and attending in the Fall of 2019 or Spring of 2020 to be eligible for the award. The award is presented upon receipt of enrollment from the post-secondary institution is received by the Scholarship/Bursary Committee of the Alberni Valley Branch 293. **Vast eligible.**

3 CHINESE CANADIAN SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP - \$750

Awarded to a member of the local Chinese community. Award based on academic marks and recipient must be accepted by a Post-Secondary Institution to further his or her education.

4 NORTH ISLAND COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL BURSARY - \$1,000

Awarded to a grade 12 graduate who will be attending North Island College on a full-time basis in the following year. Students will be evaluated partially on the basis of need and must have a minimum C+ average. This Bursary is provided by the NIC Foundation to a High School student in our region and is intended to encourage and support graduating students who plan to attend North Island College.

5 BRIAN ANTHONY FAMILY BURSARY “IN MEMORY OF BRIAN ANTHONY” - \$500

Preference to candidates choosing Physiotherapy, or a medical related field. Grades, volunteerism and financial need will be taken into consideration. **VAST Eligible.**

SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES WITH SPECIFIC CRITERIA

****Do you qualify? Check criteria carefully!**

6 BETA SIGMA PHI – BETA RHO MASTER SORORITY CHAPTER BURSARY - \$350

Applicants must be related to an active Beta Sigma Phi member. Any student at ADSS planning to continue their education within (1) year, at a post-secondary institution or certified trades program, can apply. Proof of registration at a post-secondary institution or trades program is required. Financial need as well as scholastic standing will be considered.

7 BETA SIGMA PHI - PRECEPTOR GAMMA BETA CHAPTER BURSARY – \$300

Awarded to family member of an active member of Beta Sigma Phi. Must attend a postsecondary institution within eight months of graduation. Financial need as well as scholastic standing will be considered. Must include name of family member. We would expect that the candidate would have done some service or volunteer work in the community. **VAST eligible.**

8 BETA SIGMA PHI GAMMA GAMMA MASTER BURSARY - \$300

Awarded to a son, daughter, or grandchild of an active member of Beta Sigma Phi. Must attend a post-secondary institution within eight months of graduation. Financial need as well as scholastic standing will be considered.

9 ORDER OF EASTERN STAR BURSARY - \$500

Awarded to a student who has Masonic affiliation or membership (Order of the Eastern Star, Masons, Job's Daughters or DeMolay). State the name of the member and the Masonic organization under which the applicant is claiming relationship. Marks, extracurricular activities, community service over and above graduation requirements and financial need will be considered. Letters of recommendation will be helpful. Receipt of the monies will be contingent upon proof of acceptance into an accredited post-secondary institution with classes starting within 8 months, and will be paid directly to the institution. Masonic affiliation must be verified with Alberni Chapter #100, contact Anne McDonald. **VAST eligible.**

10 EMCON SERVICES BURSARY - \$500

Awarded annually to a son or daughter (or grandchild) of an employee of EMCON Services Inc. If there are no children of an EMCON Employee, a student meeting the other criteria may be selected. The bursary will be awarded to graduates who are going on to further education at a post-secondary institution. Preference is to be given to candidates pursuing industry-related trades (heavy duty mechanics, welding, bridge worker, industrial warehousing etc.) The bursary awarded must be used during the school year immediately following graduation. The criteria for this bursary will be focused on need, effort and interest and responsibility, rather than strict academics (C+ average or better preferred). This is a District bursary (SD70) awarded to ONE student in this district – either at ADSS or Ucluelet Secondary.

11 NORA MONCUR MEMORIAL BURSARY - \$300

This bursary will be awarded to an ADSS student who plans continued education within 18 months. Monies must be claimed within 18 months of award. Student must provide proof of registration in a University, College, Technical, Vocational, or accredited Arts program. Award is based on scholastic achievement and school and/or community involvement. Must have an average of C+ or better in student's five best subjects.

12 ALBERNI DISTRICT COOPERATIVE ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIPS – 3 x \$1,000

(In Memory of Mr. Harold E. Turner)

These 3 Awards are open to members and members' children, grandchildren or guardian. Applicants must indicate the qualifying member's name and member's CO-OP number on the application under "Qualification for scholarship, be specific". Must be registered at ADSS in grade 12, or student of VAST, planning to attend any post-secondary institution starting within fifteen months of graduation. Academic achievement, school and community involvement and need will be considered. **Write a brief essay (75 words+) on "What is a Cooperative Association." (You must write the essay to be considered.)** All applicants will receive a \$10 gift card for any CO-OP location. **VAST Eligible.**

13 ALBERNI VALLEY CATHOLIC WOMEN'S LEAGUE BURSARY - \$500

Awarded to a student (boy or girl) who, immediately following graduation, is enrolled in full-time studies at any post-secondary institution. Must be a CWL member, be related to a CWL member, or a parishioner at Holy Family/Notre Dame Catholic Church. Church involvement, scholastic achievement & financial need will be considered. **VAST Eligible.**

14 ALBERNI DISTRICT TEACHERS' UNION BURSARIES - 2 x \$500

Award to be made to graduates who are students planning post-secondary education. This award will be made on the basis of financial need, but marks, school and community involvement, will also be considered. Preference will be given to sons and daughters of current or retired ADTU members.

15 ALBERNI DISTRICT TEACHERS' UNION SCHOLARSHIPS - 5 x \$700

Awarded to students proceeding to post-secondary education in this academic year, following graduation. Preference given to dependents of current or retired ADTU members. Marks and financial need considered.

16 PORT ALBERNI AND DISTRICT LABOUR COUNCIL "WALTER BEHN MEMORIAL BURSARY" - \$500

Awarded to a student at Alberni District Secondary School who will be registered in any postsecondary educational institute within eight months of graduation. Applicant must be a MEMBER OF OR LEGAL DEPENDENT OF a member of ANY union affiliated with the Port Alberni and District Labor Council (Must note which union on application). The following will be considered: marks, marks pertaining to a chosen field, plans for the future, financial need. **Must write a paragraph on what you think a Union is. If a paragraph is not included, application will be discarded. Please list union applicant or legal dependent is affiliated with.**

17 ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS SCHOOL DISTRICT #70 PRINCIPALS/ VICE-PRINCIPALS SCHOLARSHIPS – 2 x \$500

Awarded to two students who have consistently had strong academic standing in grades 10-12. They will also have demonstrated leadership abilities through participation in school and community activities, and had noteworthy service to the school or community. Excellence in one other area from Fine Arts or Athletics is also required. The recipients must also be proceeding to a post-secondary institution within eighteen months of graduation. Preference will be given to a dependent of an Administrative Officer who meets the above criteria but is open to all students. **VAST eligible.**

18 E.J. HUGHES BURSARY – 2 x \$1000

Awarded to a deserving student who is proceeding to a degree, diploma or certificate granting program at a post-secondary institution located outside of the Alberni Valley, but within Canada or the United States of America. Recipients shall be residents of the city of Port Alberni or the traditional territories of the Hupacasath and Tseshaht First Nations. Applicants are expected to research and learn about EJ Hughes. **Each application must include a brief statement highlighting something they have learned about him and why it's meaningful to them (approximately 100 words).**

19 UNIFOR LOCAL #592 JACK BREUKER MEMORIAL BURSARY" - \$1000

Awarded to a member or a legal dependent of a member of Local #592. Student must be proceeding to any post-secondary institution. Please include a letter which should have a "theme" of how has your parent having a union job affected your family. Academic standing and personal resume will be considered.

20 UNIFOR LOCAL #592 DAVID FRASER MEMORIAL BURSARY" - \$1000

Awarded to a member or a legal dependent of a member of Local #592. Student must be proceeding to any post-secondary institution. Please include a letter which should have a "theme" of how has your parent having a union job affected your family. Academic standing and personal resume will be considered.

21 UNIFOR LOCAL #592 “DARYL DEROOY MEMORIAL BURSARY” – \$1000

Awarded to a member or a legal dependent of a member of Local #592. Student must be proceeding to any post-secondary institution. Please include a letter which should have a “theme” of how has your parent having a union job affected your family. Academic standing and personal resume will be considered.

22 CANADIAN UNION OF PUBLIC EMPLOYEES LOCAL #727 BURSARIES (SD #70 EMPLOYEES) 3 x \$1,000 (CUPE #727)

Must be a dependent of, or a member of in good standing, Local #727, proceeding to any postsecondary institution within 18 months of graduation. Financial need, community/school service and marks will be considered.

**23 CANADIAN UNION OF PUBLIC EMPLOYEES LOCAL #118 BURSARY
(CITY OF PORT ALBERNI & PARKS & RECREATION EMPLOYEES) - \$1000 (CUPE #118)**

Must be a dependent of, or a member of, Local 118, proceeding to any post-secondary institution starting within 15 months of graduation. Financial need and marks will be considered. **VAST eligible.**

24 CANADIAN UNION OF PUBLIC EMPLOYEES LOCAL ##118 (CITY OF PORT ALBERNI & PARKS & RECREATION EMPLOYEES) “IN MEMORY OF MONA COLCLOUGH” - \$1000

The student must be a dependent, or a member of Local #118. Proceeding to any post-secondary institution. Starting within 15 months of graduation. Financial need. Marks will be considered. Volunteering is an asset. **VAST eligible.**

25 PORT ALBERNI FIRE DEPARTMENT BURSARY- \$150

Bursary to be awarded to a dependent of a member of IAFF Local #1667. Student must be proceeding to any post-secondary institution. Applicants must submit a letter which includes their post-secondary plans.

26 ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION, Alberni Valley Branch #293 MEMORIAL Bursaries - 3 x \$500

Awarded to a son/daughter or grandson/granddaughter of a Military Service Veteran or a member of Legion Branch Alberni Valley 293 in good standing who is proceeding to a post-secondary institution. This applicant must be enrolled in a post-secondary institution and attending in the Fall of 2019 or Spring of 2020 to be eligible for the award. The award is presented upon receipt of enrollment from the post-secondary institution is received by the Scholarship/Bursary Committee of the Alberni Valley Branch 293. **Vast eligible.**

27 ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION Alberni Valley Branch 293 LADIES AUXILIARY BURSARY - \$500

Awarded to a student who has a connection to the Royal Canadian Legion Alberni Valley Branch #293, e.g. Family member. Student **must** be proceeding to a post-secondary institution **in September 2019.**

28 KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS, ALBERNI VALLEY COUNCIL #3435 BURSARIES - 2 x \$500

Awarded to a student enrolled in a full-year program at any British Columbian post-secondary institution. Award based on satisfactory achievement and financial need. Preference could be given to dependents of Council #3435 members. Recipient must enroll within 14 months of graduation from high school. Bursary will be paid after proof of enrollment.

29 KIWANIS CLUB BURSARY – 2 x \$500

Candidates must register and attend any post-secondary institution within fifteen months of graduation. Marks and financial need will be considered. Students must have done volunteer work for Kiwanis. **VAST Eligible.**

30 CATALYST PAPER SCHOLARSHIPS – 3 x \$1000

S To be eligible, the applicant must be planning to become a full-time student at a technical institute, community college or accredited public university, following high school graduation and receipt of the award. Deferment of one academic year is permitted where the applicant is participating in a recognized Grade 12 student exchange program.

Catalyst Paper Port Alberni applicants who qualify are **any ADSS student graduating and/or Vancouver Island high school students who are dependents of a current Catalyst Paper Port Alberni Division employee.** Applicants must be graduating in 2019.

31 KLITSA TUTORING BURSARY – 2 x \$1000

Awarded to students who are, or have been, clients of Klitsa Tutoring. Students will have attended Klitsa Tutoring for academic subject support for at least one semester during their grade 9 to 12 studies, and be proceeding to any post-secondary institution within 16 months of graduation. Please include a 50-100 word paragraph explaining how tutoring has helped you achieve your academic goals. This award is not determined by marks – financial need and demonstrated improvement in academic efforts will take priority. Bursary will be paid after proof of enrollment. **VAST eligible.**

SPECIFIC ADSS PROGRAMS

32 PORTAL PLAYERS PERFORMING ARTS BURSARY - \$500 (Theatre)

Must be a “performing arts” student, (in or out of school). Candidate must be planning to attend a post-secondary institution of a full-time basis with intent to pursue performing arts (either performance or production). Scholastic achievement will be considered. Preference given to students who are, or have been involved with, Portal Players Dramatic Society productions or child and youth programs. **Give details of Alberni Valley performing arts involvement. VAST Eligible.**

33 PORT ALBERNI ORCHESTRA & CHORUS SOCIETY BURSARY – \$500 (Music)

Bursary is limited to students who are entering a post-secondary music program in the Fall of 2019. Proof of acceptance to institution is required.



34 CANADIAN PARENTS FOR FRENCH BURSARY – \$500 (Immersion)

S This bursary will be awarded to a graduating student of the French Immersion program whose family has been a member of the Canadian Parents for French for at least three years prior to graduation. Applicants must have a demonstrated financial need and must plan to attend a post-secondary institution within 2 years of graduation. Applications are to include a short essay answering the following questions: What benefits has the FI program provided you as a student? How will becoming bilingual will benefit you in the future? Preference will be given to students of families with long standing CPF memberships. Strong consideration will be given to those who have volunteered with CPF directly and to those whose families have actively participated in the CPF organization. Please provide as much detail as possible when describing your and your families' involvement with the CPF organization. Funds will be disbursed upon proof of registration in the recipients chosen post-secondary institution. **VAST Eligible.**

35 CANADIAN PARENTS FOR FRENCH SCHOLARSHIP - \$500 (Immersion)

S This scholarship will be awarded to a graduating student of the French Immersion program whose family has been a member of the Canadian Parents for French for at least three years prior to graduation. Applicants must show proof of academic excellence in their grade 12 year and must plan to attend a post-secondary institution within 2 years of graduation. Applications are to include a short essay answering the following questions: What benefits has the FI program provided you as a student? How will becoming bilingual will benefit you in the future? Preference will be given to students of families with long standing CPF memberships. Strong consideration will be given to those who have volunteered with CPF directly and to those whose families have actively participated in the CPF organization. Please provide as much detail as possible when describing your and your families' involvement with the CPF organization. Funds will be disbursed upon proof of registration in the recipients chosen post-secondary institution. **VAST Eligible.**

36 COMMUNITY ARTS COUNCIL of the Alberni Valley BURSARY - \$250 (Arts)

Award based on performance and achievement of the individual in the Arts, past and present, academic achievement and financial need. MUST be planning a study in the Arts and MUST be registered. i.e.: Fine Arts, Drama, Music, Visual arts, Creative Writing. Must attend a postsecondary institution starting within eight months of graduation. (Proof of Registration is required) **VAST Eligible.**

37 GLENN WONG MEMORIAL FUND BURSARY 2 x \$500 (Sustainable Resources)

This bursary will be awarded to two SD#70 students who have demonstrated commitment to community involvement and have financial need. The recipients will also be chosen based on academic achievement, particularly Sustainable Resources. The students must also plan to attend a post-secondary institution within fifteen months of graduation.

38 MAURICE JONES MUSIC AWARD - \$500 (Music)

Awarded to a student who has made a contribution towards excellence in music during his/her high school years. Recipient must be entering a post-secondary institution and must clearly state on application how music will be a part of their life in the future. Payment will be made upon presentation of proof of tuition. Preference will be given to a student who has a financial need. The award will not be given if there is not an appropriate candidate.

39 ALBERNI VALLEY KENNEL CLUB BURSARY - \$500 (Animal Care)

Awarded to a student pursuing a career in animal care. Preference will be given to students planning a career in Veterinary Medicine. Marks, attendance, financial need and volunteerism will all be considered as well. Must attend a post-secondary institution starting within twelve months of graduation. (Proof of Registration is required).



ENTERING A SPECIFIC AREA OF STUDY

40 WEST COAST GENERAL HOSPITAL AUXILIARY BURSARY - 2 x \$2000 (Health Care)

Awarded to students continuing their educations in the health care field, beginning within 24 months of high school graduation. (Award \$1000 in September and \$1000 in January.) Scholastic achievement and need will be considered.

41 GRIFFIN DOLLING MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP – \$800 (Engineering)

Awarded to a student who is pursuing post-secondary education in Engineering. Marks, Attendance, Community Service and School Citizenship will all be considered. Must be enrolled in post-secondary program within 18 months of high school graduation.

42 ALBERNI DISTRICT RETIRED TEACHERS BURSARY – \$600 (Education)

Awarded to a student entering a post-secondary institution within eight months of receiving the award. Must be pursuing a course of education leading to a qualified teacher's certificate. Financial need, marks, school and/or community involvement will be considered.

43 ALBERNI VALLEY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE BURSARY - \$500 (Business)

Awarded to a graduating student going to a University starting within eight months of graduation. Preference is given to a student that will be pursuing a Business Degree of some discipline.

44 DR. BRENT MANSON – FAMILY CHIROPRACTIC BURSARY - \$250 (Health Field)

Awarded to a student entering any post-secondary institution starting within fifteen months of Graduation. Student must demonstrate a good work ethic, have a financial need and be going into the field of health sciences. Involvement in the Community will also be taken in to consideration. **VAST eligible.**

45 ART RAVE BURSARY - \$250.00 (Arts)

Awarded to a graduate based on performance, achievement and a letter of reference from an ADSS Fine Arts faculty member. Student must be planning on attending Post-Secondary studies in the Arts – Fine Arts, Visual Arts, Music, Graphic Arts, Media, Creative Writing, or Animation within 8 months of graduation. Proof of registration is required. **VAST eligible.**

46 ALBERNI FARMERS' INSTITUTE – BURSARY - \$250 (Agriculture)

This bursary will be awarded to a graduate of ADSS (VAST included) who: will be proceeding to a recognized program in Agriculture, including certificate diploma courses in various Farming and Agriculture disciplines focusing on food production for commercial purposes. Proof of enrollment must be submitted prior to the bursary being awarded. Previous involvement or experience in Agriculture an asset. Demonstrated need. Student can demonstrate that program will lead to employment. **Suggested Courses, Programs that may fit the bursary:**

- Olds College, Alberta – Agriculture Programs
- University of the Fraser Valley - Dept. of Agriculture/Horticulture
- UBC Dept. of Plant Science
- Vancouver Island University – Horticulture Dept. (prefer students with a focus on food production)
- Kwantlen Polytechnic University – Institute for Sustainable Horticulture
- Gaia College – Diploma in Organic Land Care
- Permaculture Institute of BC (Kootenays)
- Kwantlen – Bachelor Applied Science in Sustainable Agriculture

47 HOSPITAL EMPLOYEES UNION SCHOLARSHIP - \$250 (Health Careers)

Awarded to a family member of an active member of the HEU. Must attend a post-secondary institution within eight months of graduation. Monies must be claimed within 12 months of award. Proof of registration is required. Graduate must be registered in a program pursuing HEU careers. **Please include a letter stating the pros and cons of heaving unions in the workplace.**

48 SPIRIT SQUARE FARMERS MARKET BURSARY - \$1000 (Agriculture)

This bursary will be awarded to a graduating student who plans to continue their education in the agricultural field (animal medicine, agronomics, horticulture, etc.) within two years of Graduation. Funds will be advanced upon proof of tuition registration.

49 BARRY GUS CRISIS RESPONSE MEMORIAL FUND BURSARY - \$250 (Counselling, Social Work, Health Field)

Awarded to an ADSS student entering a post-secondary institution within eight months of receiving the award. Must be pursuing a course of education leading to a qualified teacher's certificate. Preference will be given to students who have volunteered for their student Grad Committee or actively participated in the fundraising of Prom. **Please write a short paragraph (max 400 words) on “Where you would like to be in 5 years and what you will be doing?”**

94 ARROWSMITH ROTARY CLUB BURSARY – \$500
